


SVVSD has a zero tolerance policy. Every child has a right to come to school without the threat of violence. Expulsion with any threat.





- Title IX- 0 Formal Title IX violations in our system this year.
  - Compliance Officer Discrimination/Harassment- Ensure that our environments are free of discrimination based on sex in educational programs.
- 504- 2141 Students in our system who have 504 plans.
- Compliance Officer/District Coordinator- Ensure that students with disabilities receive reasonable accommodations
- Child Welfare Education Liaison (Lourdes Buck)- 90+ Students in our system who are in foster care.
  - Stabilize the education environment and assist to remove barriers (i.e. high mobility) that impede students from accessing a Free & Appropriate Public Education
- Threat Assessment- Well over 250 Initial Threat Screens 90 Full Threat Assessments conducted this year.
  - Identify, assess, and mitigate legitimate threats to our schools.
  - Internal team of 19 stakeholders who meet weekly to review threat screens.

  - Health Services Coordinator-Provides supervision, oversight and leadership to 16 school nurses, 54 health clerks, and manages school health grants; threat assessment team facilitator 16 School Nurses and 54 Health Clerks

  - Hearing and Vision Screening Team
    Health Services Secretary and District Health Clerk
- Primary roles of the school nurse:

   Provides nurse care coordination and management of chronic illnesses such as diabetes, asthma, life threatening allergies, seizure disorders, and other significant illnesses. Trains and delegates medical and emergency procedures to unlicensed staff.

  - Provides supervision to 54 health clerks.

    Coordinates with local public health departments for disease control management and prevention.

    Ensures compliance of board policies related to health such as mandatory vision screening, immunization, medication administration, etc.
  - Collaborates with school health teams to address issues such as chronic absences, alternatives to suspensions, mental health concerns, IEP's, 504's, etc.

The School Health Services Program allows school districts to seek reimbursement for Medicaid covered services What are covered services?

- Speech Language Pathology
- Occupational Therapy
- Physical Therapy
- Nursing Services and Personal Care Psychology, Counseling and Social Work

Colorado law requires that funds are used to provide enhanced health and health related services to all district

Examples for uses are

- Expanding health care services personnel (nurses, social workers, psychologists, etc.)
- Purchasing supplies and/or equipment
- Outreach services (staff on site to help direct families to state and federal sponsored programs)
