# Niwot Elementary School's PTAC General Meeting Minutes Tuesday October 18, 2016

## **OPENING:**

The meeting was called to order by President Donna Blondeau at 9:22am with 17 members present (7 Board members; 10 regular members).

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Overview of the agenda was provided.

# **Todd Piccone - Niwot Elementary Proposed Traffic Plan - Reconstruction**

- Main goal is to separate bus and car traffic
- Increase parent queuing triple the amount of current space; includes a drive lane
- Bus drop off loop on west side of school; will double as a surface play during the day as the bus drop off is not fenced off.
- Additional staff parking out of the mix of drop off / pick up
- Accessibility to sidewalks, (incorporating one on the north side of Morton and widening the south side) is a concern A conversation has been initiated with Boulder County regarding walkers and bikers to and from the school; bike rack location(s).
- Z Pass Plus ability to monitor students getting on and off the bus for those students open enrolled.
- Broad discussion regarding bus transportation within the school district
- \$1.2million currently identified for this project
- Security entrance is not committed for Summer 2017 but the project will proceed accordingly during the summer.

Growth plans extend out for the district and predictions are made based on expected growth. This information is then used to discuss future of existing and new school constructions. It is written in Board Policy and can be found on the district website. A reserve account does not exist for building schools and it must go back to Voters when time warrants.

# Hadley Solomon: Grassroots St Vrain

Formed in 2008 when significant number of teachers were cut.

Important videos on website explaining the funding of school budgets in the state of Colorado.

Leadership St Vrain provides an abundant amount of information regarding financing.

Colorado State Funding Formula - video (operating budgets)

Local Dollars for Local Schools - video

Last yr SVVSD received \$28million less in 2015 due to the Negative Factor; 63% State 37% local MLO - 2008 and 2012: additional \$1200 per students (this is a permanent change - usually operating expenses)

Current Bond Issue: last bond was 2008; SVVSD is growing at 800 students/yr: \$260 million (relatively smaller bond to those surrounding districts) will address school repairs / security / space for innovation centers

(What it means for Niwot Elementary: bus and parking routes, internal upgrades) Colorado is the only state where legislature cannot raise taxes on its own.

Ammendment 23 (2010) - mandatory increase for per pupil funding: Inflation +1% for 10 yrs and then inflation only after.
